

They're alive with enthusiasm and energy, and it's only 10am on a dull, grey morning. You get the impression words such as 'dull' and 'grey' long left the lexicon of Ponsonby retail manager Stephanie Connor and her colleague Andon Monk. Their infectious zeal is no real surprise though; a quick scope of the storefront makes it clear that this is No Ordinary Retail Outlet. The windows are colourfully dressed and designed for impact, with one in particular housing a massive Western-themed piece of art. Who is the Titian in training? Andon.

'Everyone talks about the window,' Stephanie tells me. 'People stand there and watch Andon paint. They've even been coming in this morning and asking when he will be finished.'

Becoming a talking point on this stretch of visually arresting real estate is no mean feat, but the store itself, which has a very high customer count, seems to be a magnet. The cliché 'community flavour' is only a cliché here, because it's true. It is the sort of store where regular customers stop you in the street to chat.

'They're a very diverse bunch,' proffers Stephanie, 'and you can have some extremely interesting conversations. And we're always so busy.' There do seem to be at least a dozen people in the store at any one time, milling around, wanting to know about this or that wine, wanting to talk, buying something they haven't tried before.

Tickety-boo as it all seems to be, there are some plans in development, too. There is a large space above the store with stunning views of the city which has been earmarked for greater things, including use as a tasting room and home to a regular wine club. Until then, there is always a bottle open for customers to try, and, despite the busyness, it's clear that there is always time to talk.

I wouldn't call it 'old style' customer service - these two are too colourful for that - but it is the sort of enthusiastic service backed with a knowledge of wine that makes you feel delighted you put your head in the door in the first place.

Far from being an easy off-the-vine-and-onto-the-bottlingline kinda wine, 'oak-less' means that there is nowhere to hide. Not for the fruit, nor the winemaker. Any blemish or fault will immediately show up in the final wine. Not here, though; the pristine fruit is lashed to a lush crush of peaches and melons. Invigorating and satisfying.

Ti Point τwo Matakana Merlot Cabernet Franc 2007

Grown north of Matakana and a deep-fried scallop's throw from the thoroughly excellent Leigh fish 'n' chip shop, this is a silky smooth blend of Matron Merlot and the rather chipper underling Cabernet Franc, whose delicious softness and high fruit impact is unmissable if you know where to look. Small parcels of hand-picked ambrosia are gently smuggled through in older oak, so a gentle wooden imprint on bright, ripe fruit is the very appealing result.

Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc 2008

Enthusiastic and vibrant, with intense gooseberry and passionfruit aromas and an underlying flintiness. An excitingly broad palate with citrus leaning leanly on the fence of richness, the acidity provides a firm backbone rather than something that removes the roof of your mouth at twenty paces, as can be the case with untrammelled versions of Sauvignon Blanc. An excellent expression that proves no variety is beyond them at Akkers Central. With 200,000 hectares under vine, Argentina is the fourth-largest producer in the world. Historically, its wine production was based on satisfying the voracious appetite of its own inhabitants, and until recent times it exported very little.

Argentina does not have any indigenous grapes; vitis vinifera cuttings were brought into the country by Spanish priests, and winemaking well established in the Mendoza region by the 16th century. Today, Mendoza's wineries are responsible for about 75 % of the country's production and 95% of all exports.

Located in the foothills of the Andes, Mendoza has approximately 150,000 hectares of vineyards, more than the combined acreage of Australia and New Zealand. A distinctive aspect of Mendozan vineyards is their naturally healthy condition, courtesy of a dry, sunny climate that reduces disease.

A combination of overseas investment and flying winemakers has introduced modern technical know-how, while grape yields have been drastically reduced and significant temperature-controlled fermentation equipment introduced.

Malbec and Cabernet are the leading varieties for red wines, but there is also some Merlot, Sangiovese, Tempranillo, Syrah, Bonardo and Pinot Noir. Whites are produced from Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc, Riesling and, increasingly, Viognier. Things are changing fast in Argentina, and there is no doubt that it has the potential to become a major force in the fine wine markets of the world.

Chakana's reserve wines are produced in relatively limited quantities. This was matured for twelve months in French and American oak and bottle-aged for six months prior to release. It is a rich, generously-flavoured and elegantly-structured wine, enhanced by smooth, supple tannins that provide a silky mouthfeel. Winemaking was introduced into Chile by Spanish Conquistadores and missionaries in the mid-sixteenth century. Following independence from Spain, immigrant farmers from Europe introduced vine cuttings, notably Bordeaux varietals.

PURPLE ANGEL

a taste of

By the time powdery mildew and phylloxera devastated European vineyards in the late 19th century, Chile had accumulated its own collection of healthy vitis vinifera cuttings. Today it is, famously, the only country which remains free of phylloxera and powdery mildew, freeing growers from frequent spraying and expensive grafting on resistant rootstocks.

Chile's vineyards enjoy a temperate maritime climate with a long, dry ripening season. The vineyards are influenced by the country's two dominant forces, the Andes and the Pacific Ocean; the mountains provide irrigating water and the Pacific has a cooling influence. The main vinifera varieties grown include Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Syrah and the interesting Carménère for reds, and for whites, Chardonnay and Sauvignon Blanc.

In the last decade, vineyard yields have been lowered and modern winemaking practices introduced, in the process transforming Chilean wine so that after 500 years, the country has emerged as one of the most important players in world markets, and the flagship for the wines of South America.

Classic Series Cabernet Sauvignon 2007

An 85% Cabernet Sauvignon, 15% Merlot blend from Montes' Colchagua Valley vineyard, this was matured for six months in new and seasoned American oak. It is a deep, dark, glossy wine with a bouquet of spiceedged blackberry and plum. The full-bodied palate has persistent berryfruit flavours supported by chocolate nuances, mellow tannins and a fine finish. Minimally filtered, the wine will benefit from decanting.

Montes Alpha Syrah 2006

This is a very northern Rhône-like Syrah, a blend of 90% Syrah, with 7% Cabernet to add structure and 3% Viognier to provide lifted aromatics. The fruit was harvested from Montes' low-yielding La Finca vineyard in the Apalta Valley. It is an intense, almost opaque wine, with a lovely bouquet displaying white pepper, cherry, and plum aromas embellished by hints of chocolate, earthy notes and integrated oak. Elegantly structured and beautifully poised, with persistent fruit flavours and a suave mouthfeel.

American oak, it is a dark purple colour, opening with lush damson plum and violet aromas that lead on to floral and spice notes. The palate possesses a rather voluptuous character, with ripe plum flavours, hints of raisin and a touch of tobacco. Full bodied and silky in texture, it has a lingering, savoury finish.

Harmonious and balanced, it is a smooth, sophisticated wine with a long aftertaste.

Purple Angel is predominately Carménère with a touch of Petit Verdot. Half the Carménère was grown in the La Finca vineyard and half in the Archangel Estate, hence the name. Following primary and malolactic fermentation, the wine was aged in French barriques for eighteen months. It is an unfiltered wine with a deep, youthful colour and a concentrated bouquet of currant, chocolate and spicy oak. Layers of lush fruit and mocha notes are complemented by the spicy oak and enhanced by ripe tannins. Outstanding.

Carried by a delicate, consistent mousse, you get peaches and white fruit sweetened by vanilla and tarted by citrus. Not the mass-produced, bland bubbles that blondes with bling slog over a few lobster tails of a lunchtime in Venice. The grapes are handpicked, the wine carefully handmade. The key is freshness and vigour, its breath-of-fresh-air appley flavours and citric acidity making it a wonderful first glass, be that lunch, early evening or whatever.



Southern Rhône Valley

The Southern Rhône has a Mediterranean climate with mild winters and hot summers, the rugged landscape providing a diverse range of microclimates and terroirs that deliver a smorgasbord of wines. Whereas Syrah is king in the north, in the southern appellations it plays second fiddle to Grenache, Mourvèdre and Cinsault.

There are no official classifications such as 'Premier Cru' in the Rhône; the AOC (Appellation d'Origine Contrôlée) designations start with the regional Côtes du Rhône, step up to Côtes du Rhône-Villages and then to individual AOC communes.

The majority of communes with their own AOC appellations are on the eastern side of the Rhône. The most famous, and usually most expensive, is Châteauneuf-du-Pape, but the stylistically individual, Grenache-dominated blends of Gigondas, Vacqueyras and Vinsobres offer excellent value.

The most distinctive wines are the fortified Muscats from the Beaumesde-Venise appellation. On the west bank of the Rhône are the appellations of Tavel and Lirac. Lirac produces very reliable red, white and rosé wines, and Tavel is justly famous for its rosés. Collectively, the wines from these communes are the best and most consistent of the Southern Rhône.

Château Mont-Redon Châteauneuf-du-Pape 2005




