However, it's important as well that a winemaker delivers at the very top end of his or her craft; with Sacred Hill's access to myriad excellent sites and tiny parcels of pure and perfect terroir, the idea of blending this brilliance away is too awful to contemplate.

Hence the Special Selection series, which celebrates the very best Sacred Hill sites, and produces expressions of the varieties grown in the various terroir that are unique, characterful and, frankly, quite extraordinary. Conditions don't allow Special Selection wines to be made every year, but when they do, the annual release of the series is cause for some celebration.

Herewith, then, the 2007 releases. From the legendary Rifleman's Chardonnay to the sumptuous Deerstalkers Syrah, and from key Hawke's Bay sites, these are exotic, excellent expressions, handmade, crafted and nurtured through the winemaking process, allowing the wines to truly reflect where they come from and the pure varietal expression to shine through.



Viva la Peter, for this is a very smart little pretender, with a neat, sweet, fruit attack, plenty of push and persistence on the palate and a very tasty cherry-fied finish. Showing a sense of humour - this is off the Guinea Pig Block, meaning take liberally internally but, you know, not too seriously. Excellent.

Winemaker Tracy Haslam is fascinated with Bordeaux and much renowned for the claret-style wines she produces off her estate near Matakana, but it's great to see her wresting a solid Syrah from an excellent site in Hawke's Bay. Very much a handmade wine, the top-notch fruit has a twelve-month oaken lie down, so don't assume \$16.90 means lack of complexity. In fact there's plenty going on, floral, spice and chocolate characters filling out the warm fruit on a palate that is generous and long.

A splendidly flavoursome and warming wine, a blend of old Grenache vines, Cabernet and Merlot. You get heaps of fruit, a splinter of spice and the structure and weight to complement some savoury piece of culinary genius, while they get full marks for a modern, New World style that delivers all that's good about Spain; price and character, and sheer class that will stump most of the competition. From Navarra, the region over the fence from Rioja, an area seriously starting to challenge Rioja's crown as the king of Spanish wine regions.

They're a kind of a collective, Earthworks, rather than a roading gang, although they could probably make a better job of the Puhoi tunnel than whoever's on the case... Anyway, vines young and old ensure plenty of concentrated flavour and some excited, jumping around fruit as well. Bright blue fruit and mulberries leap out, with hints of sweet spice and toast. Brambles and white pepper complete a wine of much presence.

The Braikovich family

Buying wine, you need to be a little wary of statistics. With every drinker a blogger and every blogger an expert, it pays to see where those magical five star reviews and 95 point ratings really come from before you mortgage the east wing for a case of the good stuff. That said, I was impressed when I saw a recent piece in the Wine Spectator where resident scribe, Harvey Steiman, reminded the world that New Zealand wasn't just about Pinot and Sauvignon Blanc and, well, had anyone tried a Kumeu River Chardonnay lately?

'The structure was tight and mouth-watering with bracing acidity, yet their flavour profile was impressively generous and broad, hitting every note on the scale and always with the kind of minerality we have come to expect only from the best white Burgundies. Tasting them blind, I rated them all between 90 and 94 points.' Harvey Steiman, Spectator, on Kumeu River Chardonnay.

Out of 23 Kumeu River Chardonnays tasted in the last ten years in Spectator, a staggering 21 have received scores of 90 points or more. To deliver that sort of consistency and quality is nothing short of breathtaking. It's worth mentioning because I think we forget, particularly those of us here in the North, that some of the world's greatest wines are being produced just down the road at Kumeu. The release of the stunning 2007 Chardonnays gives us a chance to have another look at the output of the Brajkovich family, to ruminate about the family's stature and pedigree and to be able to use the word 'iconic brand' with good reason.

The Kumeu River story began in 1944 when Mick and Katé Brajkovich scraped enough together to buy a wee piece of Kumeu and, with their son Maté, tend the vines on the land. Over time, Maté, with his wife Melba and then their four children, became the force behind the Kumeu River name. Currently Michael Brajkovich, MW makes the wines (under MD Melba's watchful eye!), Milan is vineyard director and Paul markets them.

While carrying this family legacy and acknowledging tradition in all they do, innovation and a pioneering spirit are also key; Michael was one of the first winemakers prepared to proclaim to the world the benefit of screwcap closures. Kumeu River's impact on the industry should not be underestimated.

Chardonnay is king at Kumeu River; while the odd red is still made, and a Pinot Gris and Marlborough Sauvignon satisfy the eager public, Chardonnay is their focus and what Kumeu River absolutely excel at. Take this opportunity to try and buy some of the best wines New Zealand has to offer.





Dagueneau was established by Didier Dagueneau, who died tragically in an aircraft accident in 2008. This wine is from the Domaine's low-yield, biodynamic vineyard sited on clay and flint-based soils (Silex in French). A superbly rich Sauvignon with a delicious, aromatic, mineral concentrated bouquet that is echoed on the beautifully structured and balanced palate.



The palate has honey and melon flavours, a creamy texture and a lovely clean finish. According to Robert Parker, 'Delamotte has always been somewhat of an insider's house, producing high quality at realistic prices.'




Château Listran Médoc Cru Bourgeois 2005

In recent years the Listran winery has scaled down production substantially on the 70-hectare estate by lowering yields, which has resulted in higher quality wines with good concentration. The 2005 wine was traditionally vinted and matured for 14 months in new and seasoned barriques. The nose is dominated by berry and cherry aromas with spicy notes in the background. The initial ripe fruit flavours develop through the middle to display cinnamon and oak nuances complemented by a firm tannin structure.

Founder of Lake Chalice, Chris Gambitsis

It's hard to picture now, but it it's the late eighties, and Lake Chalice director Chris Gambitsis is in his (deep breath) white shirt, black tie and black slacks working at his father's restaurant in Wellington. He's been sent to open a 375ml bottle of Marque Vue for a difficult customer, unleashes the plastic cork and... 'plastic flies across the table, the wine sprays all over this guy and his wife, the cork hit a brass plaque we had on the wall, bounced off that, landed in the guy's meal, he's going off his rocker, he's sticky and covered in Marque Vue and I'm going, whoa, sorry about that dude.'

Gambo's come a long way. Of course, being Gambo, he bought the restaurant, developed a huge interest in food and wine, went to Europe, attended every tasting he could, and in 1988 decided to buy a vineyard in Marlborough. 'I thought, bugger it, I'm going to buy a vineyard.'

Russell from Marlborough Realty ('he picked me up from the airport in a Valiant Regal') had two blocks for sale, one being what is now Lake Chalice's Falcon Vineyard. Despite the head-high gorse and broom and broken trellises, Gambo says he had a gut feeling about it. 'I thought, the soil looks really crappy; this is the one for me.' And the brand was born.

Working with ex-detective and windsurfing mate Phil Binnie (who became viticulturist), and later winemaker Matt Thomson (also now a director and one of New Zealand's most highly acclaimed vignerons), determination, self-belief, sheer hard work and the odd vino have seen this fledgling brand became a serious player, both domestically and overseas.

With international trophies and loads of local awards, you could say the medal cabinet proves how good they are; but that's not the point, and Gambo would be the first to tell you so. It's what's in the bottle that counts, and over that two decade period Lake Chalice have built up a consistent, vintage-to-vintage history of excellent whites and reds, earning particular success with their Chardonnay, Riesling and Sauvignon Blanc.

And the falcon on the label? It's actually a Karearea or New Zealand falcon, a rare raptor whose protection Lake Chalice supports through the Wingspan Birds of Prey Trust, dedicated to preserving New Zealand's raptors. You have to give something back to the land, after all.


