When I arrived to talk to Steen Andrewes, Manager of our inner city Elliott Street store, the pavement was pullulating with people in pullovers, walls of black suits greeting me as I tried to negotiate my way to either of the two entrances. Feeling a surge of delight that foot traffic in the area had increased to the power of 12 overnight, I was disappointed to discover it was in fact a fire drill, instigated by the inhabitants of the Phillips Fox Tower, at the base of which nestles the store. I wondered if Steen's brief stint as an electrical engineer could help with that dreadful ringing noise...

But no, he's a wine man through and through these days is Steen. His father, Peter, worked alongside us back in the 90s, so perhaps Steen, like Sam Molloy last month, has a bit of wine in his blood, for it certainly has become his enthusiasm and passion in recent years.


Steen joined us just over eighteen months ago, keen to further his wine knowledge, 'and just to start drinking some better and more interesting wine,' he reckons. After rotating around a few of the stores, gaining experience in the idiosyncratic ways of the folk in our varied suburbs at this end of the island, Steen put his hand up to manage Elliott Street, something he - and we - are pleased he chose to do.

Sitting next to the atrium ('with definitely the best coffee around,' he reliably informs me with his infectious charm) and with its two wide glass entranceways, for a smaller store it has a busier, bigger feel than one might think. The customers almost seem to work to some sort of shift regime; during the day, the tourists from the hotels come and get excited about New Zealand wine. 'We sell heaps of Cloudy Bay and tons of Pinot,' Steen tells me.

Then, come 4pm, the office towers start emptying and dazed desk jockeys flit by for a bottle of the good vino before heading home. 'It is almost like clockwork,' Steen says, particularly on a Friday. Being the day of the week when the commuters sometimes defer their trip back to suburbia, Steen says he finds people keen to stop and talk, the lure of a bottle or two always being open at this time notwithstanding.

With the ability to talk knowledgeably one on one with those keen to find out more, and also the mechanism in place to take an order and ship wine virtually anywhere in the world (a facility made much use of at Elliott Street), Steen has all the bases covered. The busy-ness and buzz of the store reflects that, too. If only he knew how to de-wire a siren...





Claude Gisselbrecht and his mother

In a region like Alsace, where the great vineyards are divided amongst different producers, we should perhaps have a feature 'Grand Crus vineyard' or two, rather than a Feature Winery. While Alsace remains a bit of a mystery to a lot of French wine drinkers, the vineyard names are sometimes familiar; Furstentum, Frankstein, Schlossberg, for instance; and surely, what with all this dependence on terroir, the land is the key to the wine.

Well, yes and no. As a winemaker I once spoke to said, 'you can't put in what God left out.' If it's not good land, you can do what you like, you won't make topflight wine from it. By the same token, I think we've all tasted very average wines from very good sites and wondered quite how the producer got it so horribly wrong. In Alsace, the producer is key to your vinous happiness.

Herewith Gisselbrecht, then, one of the little guys of Alsace who prize terroir and tradition above all, and who make some of the most exciting wines to come out of the region. There are some large-scale producers in Alsace, and while they produce some good, solid Pinot Gris, Riesling and so forth to meet volume demands, these wines are a blend of sometimes twenty or more vineyards.

Gisselbrecht, on the other hand, offer the opportunity to try the true, individual expressions of this fascinating region that sits in the eastern foothills of the Vosges Mountains, delighting in the rain shadow and soaking up the sun. And in an area that has been part of Prussia, France, Germany, then back to France again, the fact that the Gisselbrecht family have been tending their terroir since the 17th century is a reassuring show of consistency.

Today the Gisselbrechts all work to capture that ephemeral essence that is the unique delight of great Alsatian wines; Rieslings streaked with citrus and mineral, Pinot Gris that is both unctuous and luscious yet deliciously dry, sparkling wines that delight with their frothy appeal. 'Every taste becomes a discovery, a new experience that is always exceptional,' the family says and, with some new vintage wines having just arrived, now is a very good time to get acquainted with the fine wines from this wonderful producer.

Pinot Blanc is a white mutation of the rather more revered Pinot Noir, and isn't a variety we see a lot of here. In Alsace it has a little more kudos, favoured for its richness and distinctive appley characters. It's always loathsome to cross-compare varieties, but if you like Chardonnay, try this. Peaches and peach blossom dominate the aromas, while on the palate, freshness and fruit are the key. Rich and refreshing; brilliant with sushi, as it happens.







There are currently eight different wine competitions held in New Zealand; each has a valuable contribution to make, but the results most eagerly awaited each year are those from the Air New Zealand Wine Awards. The competition, now nearly 30 years old and considered to be the official competition of the New Zealand wine industry, is owned and organised by New Zealand Winegrowers, the national organisation of the country's grape growers and winemakers.

The competition is open only to New Zealand wines, from all ten wine regions. Each year, more than 1500 wines are entered, although wineries do so at their own discretion.

The wines are judged in separate varietal categories on the 20-mark system: three points for appearance, seven for bouquet/aroma and ten points for flavour, texture, balance, etc. With elite golds earning 19-20 points, gold medals are awarded to wines of outstanding quality that attain between 18.5 and 18.9 points; wines of excellent quality and a fine example in their class reaching between 17 and 18.4 points earn silver medals, and wines well above average and gaining between 16 and 16.9 points achieve bronze medal status.

Three years ago, 'pure' medals were introduced to acknowledge not only the superior quality of a wine, but also to indicate that the wine was sustainably grown and produced. In 2007 elite gold medals were also introduced, awarded to medallists that achieve 19 marks or higher.

The wines with the highest mark in a category are awarded the trophy for the best wine in that class.

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Cider

It would be fair to say that the general impression of cider in this country is that it's either a sweet alcoholic jerkin-dropper for the inter-related bumpkins who reside in some dim corner of Cornwall, rolling their 'rs' and their cars after a few too many at the Pitch Fork & Pumpkin, or it's 9% ABV White Lightning as drunk by dribbling dossers at Tottenham Court Road tube station.

With the English being the world's biggest producers and consumers of cider, this distorted view is understandable. But it's only a small part of the picture, and cider is shedding its image and becoming a drink of the hip and happening.

We're already well down the track of 'getting' cider in this country, hence the recent Weka release and the rising popularity of Macs, Harvest and Monteith's. With the industry being worth \$4.5m, producers are tripping over themselves to get some cider to market. And we're not talking a Clydesdale and dray, here.

So, we figured as summer rolled in, it was worth having a look at some of the best ones around and giving them a whirl. And there is a bit more to it than just fermenting a few old apples in a tin bath at the back of the property.

While cider is essentially the juice of fermented apples, that's a bit like saying brewing beer involves yeast. Depending on the type of apples used, and processes adopted, cider can range in colour from clear to brown and in flavour from dry to sweet. Some sparkle, some are cloudy, some could be used to strip said tin bath of any residual Resene, and some are wonderful.

Old Mout, who have been making cider since 1947, use a traditional French recipe handed down on apple-stained paper over generations, while their Feijoa Cider picked up a gold at the New Zealand Fruit Wine and Cider Awards (where, I assume, one can rather literally compare apples with apples). So there is a cider for all tastes; grab a pack and have a cider snack. It's, um, got to be good for you.




Magners Original Irish Cider 568mL

Using seventeen different varieties of culinary apples, Magners is the original cider, the recipe and production process established back in 1935. They are the biggest purchaser of apples in Ireland, and also one of the few traditionalists who still ferment in oak vats, which adds a lot more complexity to the final beverage than pasteurising, as you could well imagine. Some pure apple juice is added to the fermenting pulp for further complexity, and just like a good Chardonnay, the apples go through a malolactic fermentation that softens the acid and broadens the palate. We are left with a rich, flavoursome, refreshingly slaking wee drop.

Rather than sending his old barrels off to the chipper, Quintin, armed with a drill and a grill rack, has made a barrique into an oven/smoker/ barbeque perfect for smoking seafood (he's a diver, y'know), as well as salmon, even racks of lamb, hell yes. And the marinades and sauces he uses, when you match the food to his sensational wines... dribbling yet?

As November sees the new vintage releases from Wild Earth, we all decided it'd be a good time to celebrate. Wild Earth, wild food, then, will see our man with the pan set up his smoker on Auckland's clean-air streets on November 14th, outside Glengarry and Dida's at 54 Jervois Road.

If the smoked oysters with ginger & lime sorbet or the duck marinated in Pinot Noir that he fed Spectator are anything to go by, this'll be a treat. Come along, grab a bite, have a chat and buy any Wild Earth wine during November to go in the draw to win one of Quintin's smokers. As some sage once said, how cool is that?

Côtes du Rhône

The official Côtes du Rhône region stretches for almost 200 kilometres from Vienne to Avignon. This generic appellation is the foundation of the whole region's wines, and comprises over 80% (35 millon cases) of the total volume produced.

The diversity of wines is considerable due to the many different soil types, micro climates and the large number of allowable varieties used. The vast majority of wines are red blends, consisting primarily of Grenache, Mourvèdre, Shiraz and Cinsault. There are also some excellent rosés to be found rivalling higher-rated AOCs, and a range of flavoursome whites.

There are over 10,000 growers in the region who either vinify and bottle their own cuvées or are contracted to sell their crops to négociants. Most, however, are members of cooperatives established in the 1920s to provide centralised winemaking facilities for growers.

While about 70% of Côtes du Rhône wines are produced by cooperatives and can be excellent value, the best and most reliable wines are made in smaller quantities and come from individual domaines, or larger estates such as Paul Jaboulet and Château Mont-Redon.

Cecchi

The Cecchi (pronounced Check-ee) family have been prominent in the Chianti region of Tuscany for over 500 years, but did not get commercially involved in the wine business until the late 19th century. In 1893, having gained a formidable reputation as a wine taster, Luigi Cecchi set up his own business as a wine broker.

The business flourished; in time Luigi's three sons Mariano, Natale and Francseco joined their father. The company expanded, rapidly establishing its reputation throughout Italy, and by 1930 Cecchi had begun to export.

From 1953, Luigi's grandson, also named Luigi, managed the company. During his tenure, the company expanded its vineyard holdings and today owns about 3,000 hectares in four different zones: Chianti Classico, San Gimignano, Maremma Toscana and Umbria. In the 1970s Cecchi moved to Castellina in Chianti Classico, building there a state-of-the-art winery.

Following the death of Luigi in 2004, his sons Cesare and Andrea, along with their mother Anita, have run the company. Cecchi's commitment to research and development, their innovative approach, understanding of the traditions of Tuscany and an unceasing desire to improve quality firmly places this family winery among the best in Italy.
