Established in 2001, Waipara Hills has consistently produced some of New Zealand's best quality wines. In its short history, the winery has been awarded more than 300 awards in local and international competitions.

To date they have won 49 gold medals, and 9 trophies that include Champion Winery, Champion Pinot Noir, Champion Gewürztraminer, and Champion Pinot Gris. Their 2007 Equinox Waipara Pinot Gris won a blue-gold at the 2008 Sydney International Wine Competition, the Southern Cross Selection Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc a gold medal and Best in Class at the UK's International Wine and Spirit Competition.

Waipara Hills wines are crafted from company-owned vineyards located in the premier wine regions of the South Island. In total, the winery owns 1000 acres of vineyards, with 250 in Marlborough's Wairau and Awatere; 500 in Waipara (the largest in the region) and 250 in Central Otago's Bendigo-Cromwell area.

Waipara Hills is a member of Sustainable Wine Growing New Zealand, and all their vineyards are managed according to those principles. The company has earmarked a further 300 acres for future development, and buys in additional fruit from selected contract growers in Marlborough to supplement their Wairau and Awatere Valley Sauvignon Blanc requirements.

Waipara Hills produces three tiers of wines: the Equinox range (single vineyard wines that express the best of the vineyard and vintage), the Southern Cross reserve wines and the Soul of the South selection of regional wines.

Winemaker Simon McGeorge is responsible for all three ranges. Canterbury born and bred, Simon has spent ten years travelling and working vintages in New Zealand, the USA, France and Australia.

'Learning what makes the wines from each of these regions unique has been invaluable,' he says. 'I've taken on the challenge of making wines that really express the different regions of New Zealand. Our vineyards, characterised by their hot daytime temperatures and cool nights, provide us with an excellent source of fruit. The result is the production of aromatic, elegant, sophisticated, world-class wines.'

'We are in the presence of a truly great vintage,' said Michel Guigal, one of the Rhône's most established and reputable producers. And while hype and French red vintages are not uncommon bed partners, most other reports floating about say that the vintage was exceptional.

The driest summer in Châteauneuf-du-Pape for two decades delivered much phenolic ripeness in both reds and whites, the final wines being highly-coloured, aromatic and full of character. One report said that these components 'were visible virtually straight off the vine, with the fruit flavours clean and straightforward.'

Already well known worldwide for their meticulously-constructed wines from their own appellations of Condrieu and Côte-Rôtie, not only have their efforts near Vienne been swiftly recognised and rewarded, their work as negociants with some of the best producers throughout the Rhône has had everyone taking notice.

The combination of an outstanding vintage, world-class producers, and our logistical talents in getting these sought-after wines here for you to experience (some, unfortunately, in limited quantities) will be a feast for anyone with a Rhône bent, and truly a treat for someone having a first foray.

Beyond the Rhône

The wine region stretching through the crescent of land from Spain's border to the Rhône estuary is the oldest in France. It encompasses the AOC region of Languedoc-Roussillon, the largest in the world and responsible for producing a third of France's total wine output. The vast majority of wines are produced by cooperatives, with a good portion marketed as Vin du Pays. In recent years, a growing number of winemakers have began to bottle their own Domaine wines, both as Vin du Pays and more specific appellations.

The AOC system in this vast region is undergoing considerable change; new appellations are being created and existing ones changing. Geography, soil types and meso climates vary considerably from vineyard to vineyard, producing wines expressive of their individual terroirs. There are twentynine official appellations in the region; some of the most reliable include Faugères in Languedoc and the AOCs Banyuls and Collioure in Roussillon.

The renaissance of this ancient region was led by far-sighted growers reducing yields and a new generation of winemakers combining modern technology with the best traditional practices. The new wave of Languedoc-Roussillon wines offers outstanding diversity, quality and value.

Beautifully clear and bright in the glass, with a hint of the year on lees on the nose before a zap of splendid strawberry fruit takes over. Quite complex, the layers of flavour bob up and down on a tingly, textured palate, while the finish is crisply moreish.

Beautiful with small plates or tapas, especially anything sausagey or slightly spicy, like chorizo, tangy olives, etc. With their exotic, refreshing whites and fruit-laden, flavoursome reds, this year's vivacious Spanish models make the perfect entertainment wines, especially at their very approachable pricepoints.
