What happened to the days of leaving school, buying a cardigan and a ticket on the gravy train of the Civil Service for the rest of your life? Doesn't anyone live the 'Gliding On' ideal anymore? Take Ngarita; she trained as a winemaker at Lincoln, and then got out of the sandpit and onto the driveway, as they say, working vintages in Marlborough and, later, Margaret River.

She claims that western Oz was a fascinating place to ply her trade, getting an opportunity to make Sauvignon/Semillon blends with a 'crisp mineral accent,' something she would have acquired while in England, doing a stint at Oddbins and then at St John's College. Surely you'd have to be over 60 and male to even get a look-in there?

'It was an amazing institution,' she tells me as I check the display cases with a spirit level in her orderly Newmarket store. 'There were dons who were living in the same bedroom that they had when they were students,' an interesting observation and one that ushers forth a scent of nasty mustiness. The musty cellars, though, contained row upon row of French gems, Margaux older than the dons themselves, all contributing to the six million quid Ngarita was responsible for. Um, yikes. No wonder it was 'all processes and procedures.'

Training and event organising at the Wine & Spirit Education Trust in London shook the dust from her shoes, and then back on home – via Australia – where Matua quickly collected her. Ngarita worked the 2010 vintage at their Waimauku HQ and subsequently toddled along to us, first managing our Kingsland store before exchanging detailed conversations with intriguing locals for precision collisions with time-poor corporates and hustly-bustly wine lovers.

The change of pace and face has re-energised our fiery Warden, although she confesses to occasionally missing the cosy community feel in the land of Kings. Two wine tastings a month and an event-driven clientele make her grateful to have an experienced and consistent team with her. 'What makes Newmarket special is we have really great staff,' she says. 'It makes the biggest difference. Everyone here knows their stuff.' Did I mention how genuine she is?

Vast and intriguing historical elements aside, it is one sizeable single entity from which Te Mata source a variety of varieties for this finelytuned range. The Sauvignon Blanc is gushingly ripe, glowing brightly and delivering a kaleidoscope of tropical delights, all cut with citric precision. Richly ripe, intensely flavoured and deliciously drinkable, all from a vineyard that was once a race track.



There are rivers of Sauvignon around, some of it celestial, some bestial, but, quality aside, if you think volume, how many wines was this judged against to get its five gold medals? Hundreds? Thousands, even? And yet it can still be rolled out at \$16.90. Remarkable. Almost opulent for Sauvignon, deeply flavoured, long on the finish and oh so gentle on the goatskin wallet.

Brookfields BERGMAN HAWKE'S BAY Chardonnay 2009

Made from 100% Central Otago Pinot, which seems rash and lavish in itself, this is a ravishing, lush, blushing beauty that is provocatively floral and indecently decadent. Like a hand-made shirt with no pants.

## CRAGGY RANGE



CHIEF WINEMAKER, ROD EASTHOPE



Located at the foot of Te Mata Peak outside Havelock North, Craggy Range has constructed a formidable reputation for itself as New Zealand's premier producer of single vineyard wines.

The key to their success has been the deep belief that wine is made in the vineyard, and that the most individual and expressive are those grown on sites that are perfectly suited to particular varieties. From the beginning, the Craggy Range ambition was to produce single vineyard wines that were a true expression of the terroir, and a key area for them has been Hawke's Bay's Gimblett Gravels.

Consisting of just 850 hectares, Gimblett Gravels is arguably Hawke's Bay's most famous sub-region. Located on the Heretaunga Plains west of Hastings, it was created about 150 years ago when the Ngaruroro River burst its banks and changed course, in the process depositing river gravels several metres thick, along with silt, sands and clays. In addition to being particularly free-draining, Gimblett Gravels is in a rain shadow and enjoys consistently warmer summers than the rest of the region.

Craggy Range recognised the potential of the Gravels early on and purchased 100 hectares. The Gimblett Gravels vineyard is the source of their award-winning single vineyard Cabernet and Merlot blends and varietals, along with their Syrah, Chardonnay, and Viognier wines. March signals the release of the 2009 wines from the vineyard; the vintage was a stunner for the Hawke's Bay region, and in the hands of skilled operators like the team at Craggy, the resulting wines are, quite simply, exceptional.

One of the oldest champagne houses, Lanson was originally established by Francois Delamotte in 1760. The company owns an impressive number of 100% rated vineyards, from which it sources a good portion of the base blend for its flagship Black Label cuvée. A golden-hued wine with delightful aromas of pip-fruit and tropical fruit embellished by brioche-like notes, the vivacious palate has a seductively plump mouthfeel, a silky mousse and a refreshing, zesty finish.



Most of us have grown to accept that the nomenclature of Burgundy wines can be confusing, but when you discover that the wines of Maison de Nicolas Potel are not anything to do with the maverick man himself, that he now has his own estate, Domaine de Bellene – located in a 15th-century abbey in Beaune – you can do an eye roll worthy of the French themselves.

The untimely death of his revered father, Gerard, and difficult financial dealings under his own name has seen the artisan launch Domaine de Bellene, with Roche de Bellene being the negoçiant arm of the business where he sources and matures top-quality wines from other growers, 'in a Savile Row rather than off the peg style,' as he recently stated. Clear?

Crystal, they sigh collectively. So, what's important is that we are able to source our first vintage from this exceptionally talented winemaker and report, delightedly, that it will be the first of many. The quality is superb; the prices exceptionally reasonable.

How the French do Pinot (with style)

So bright, vivacious and charming you'd swear it was a 2010, but that's the French for you, if you believe the unbelievers, forever trying to mesmerize us with Merino. This is an authentic, honest, wonderfully vibrant Burgundy, highly flavoured yet delivered with no small measure of subtle, but not underhand, charm. Cherries abound, and a wonderful meaty savouriness that emphasizes delicacy (and delicatessens), while the bold but backseat tannins suggest that the arc of its life is barely starting to hit the upward curve. Wondrous stuff.



Tiki Wairau Alpine Valley Sauvignon, to give it its full due, where the diurnal variations (brittle nights and shiny days) ensure major flavour and character development within the fruit. This is a ripper, with searing varietal aromatics, the tropical treats pushing through the asparagus spears to then be doused with a flinty minerality. The palate is full, ripe and fleshy, with much breadth and depth and an invigorating freshness of acid. Intensely flavoured with a lot going on, the very long finish caps off a joyous ride.



BOURGOGNE

Anyone inspired by the maverick genius and late French loon Didier Daguenau immediately gets big-ups around these parts. Didier, God rest him, was a searing Sauvignon trailblazer, and the McKean family, owners, drivers and makers of English Breakfast Tea at Tiki, clearly state their ambitious ambition, citing DD as an inspiration 'to produce the greatest single vineyard Sauvignon Blanc in the world.'

Hell, let's not muck around here. And they don't. Much lavish attention has gone into the branding, which has clearly been designed to have international appeal, but the real stuffing in their sandwiches are the prime sites they've developed in Waipara and Marlborough; they seem a good way along toward achieving their goal.

While the big noise internationally is being made about our Pinot now, folks like the McKeans just view this as static; Sauvignon Blanc is New Zealand's success story and, as Messrs Bachman, Turner and Overdrive once said, you ain't seen nothin' yet. Dah-dah.

Dry River and Te Awa commingle, shrugging off the temptation to call themselves Dry Awa or Te River, instead going all topographical and monikering themselves after Hawke's Bay's most distinctive landmark (Dave Mason's ute. No! The cliffs at the Cape!).

Silliness aside, this is a serious new brand, utilising the best of some oldvine Te Awa sites and adding to that the brilliance of Neil McCallum and Ant MacKenzie. Both men and their respective wineries have logged some serious years; they possess an understanding of what makes this terroir tick and how to get it into the bottle as new expressions of old world varietals.

'We're not here to replicate what's gone before,' they say, and rightly so; where's the challenge? Because challenge they will. Pinotage anyone? Sauvignon Blanc in a lean Bordeaux rather than a lush Hawke's Bay styling? More kudos to their Kubotas, we say. The wines are sizzling. Line up and be counted.

As the New Zealand wine industry has matured and our winemakers and generally unheralded and unassuming grape growers have notched up vintage after vintage on their Rodd & Gunn belts, patterns emerge. Weather patterns, vineyard characteristics, little pockets where certain varieties thrive surprisingly, a row here, a quarter-hectare there that's just a bit spesh, producing fruit with varietal authenticity yet a uniqueness that's worth bottling separately.

The growers who put their hands up to become part of the Farmer's Market Wine Company are now sharing these corners of Eden, and the short-run bouts of individuality are being collected under the Grower's Mark, um, marque. Rather than an excuse to charge like wounded cattle for these 'proprietor's reserve' styles, they are simply a chance for the grower to show you what their special plots can do, when given a wee nudge by an old hand, of course.

GUY AND JEREMY, OWNERS OF MT ROSA

Mt Rosa was once a colossal sheep station, and the current owners ran it as a farm through the 1990s, serious planting commencing just this side of the new millennium. Sheep and fruit seem, now, to be fully assimilated but wisely segregated, and the wines have certainly garnered more attention, praise and prizes than the Merinos.

Naturally, a rack of lamb is the ultimate complement to their excellent Pinots. With a Pinot Gris that Michael Cooper seemed willing to consider sacrificial offerings for, so impressed was he, and some other varieties that remind us Central isn't just about Pinot Noir, this is a serious contender who has managed to avoid any real trumpeting of its output until now.

With a tongue firmly planted in their cheek in all matters promotional (see the tuxedo-and-Stubbies image on the website) Mt Rosa feign frivolity yet employ earnestness when required, i.e. when turning out excellent, wellpriced expressions from one of the biggest vineyards in the Gibbston Valley. Slight oak lurks right at the back, but nothing gets in the way of that fruit-floral-earthen triumvirate that has come to steal your heart but may well throw your soul in as well. Warm and fleshy in the mouth, with lush fruit and a solid structural foundation that would suggest longevity will be a given. The finish is long, spicy and succulent, elegance and poise the lasting impression.



Sarah-Kate and Dan Dineen have worked in some pretty respectable wineries around the globe, rubbed shoulder pads with the best and turned out some stunners. So it would have to be something big, bold and beautiful to lure them to New Zealand, one would expect.

It was. The intimidating cragginess of Mt Maude, standing sentinel over the steep slopes of the Maude home vineyard and, far more elusive, the Holy Grail of the Perfect Pinot. Having the use of vines planted back in 1994 by Sarah-Kate's visionary parents, and cracking fruit from elsewhere in Central, the vinous pair have set themselves a big challenge.

Their wines are already proving to be equal to the task and, along with the PN there's a very tidy Pinot Gris, also from Central, and a Marlborough Sauvignon that'll stop you standing. But to Pinot they are drawn; unravel this beauty and drink the dream as it unfolds. As fixations go, it's sure sexier than Hornby trains or plane schedules.



#### PASTEURISATION

The process of pasteurisation involves heating the milk used to make the cheese, in order to destroy pathogenic bacteria and make the milk 'clean'. Unpasteurised cheese is made from milk that has not been thus treated, and those at risk, e.g. pregnant women and babies, should not consume it. Raw milk cheeses used to be very hard to source, but since an opening up of the rules in 2007 by the NZ Food Standards Authority, more are now available locally. Although not required to, all Dida's stores label their unpasteurised cheeses.

#### THE RHÔNE RANGERS

The Rhône wine region is vast, with over 6,000 growers and more than 1,800 wineries and cooperatives producing a range of wines under various AOC designations. The region contains two distinct sub-regions, Northern Rhône and Southern Rhône, and they each enjoy quite different geological and climatic conditions, along with their own viticultural traditions.

Northern AOCs such as Côte-Rotie, Hermitage, Crozes-Hermitage and Saint-Joseph produce quality red wines of power and elegance, which are made exclusively from the Syrah grape. White wines are very much in the minority; the most famous, Condrieu, is made from Viognier, and there are also whites made from Marsanne and Rousanne.

With its Mediterranean climate, the Southern Rhône is geographically much larger and accounts for 95% of the region's production, including the bulk of Côtes du Rhône wines. The dominant red variety here is Grenache, commonly blended with Syrah, Mourvèdre, Carignan and Cinsault. Famous appellations include Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Côtes du Ventoux, Gigondas, Tavel and Muscat de Beaumes-de-Venise, along with a couple of newer ones, Vinsobres and Rasteau. Southern Rhône wines tend to age earlier, are very approachable and represent excellent value in these cost-conscious times.

Superbly approachable and easy to drink, the 420's blackberry, cinnamon and leather notes and spicy berryfruit flavours are enhanced by judicious use of oak.

In 2010 the area of Rasteau, in the Southern Rhône, was elevated to AOC status. A blend of Grenache, Syrah and Mourvèdre, this Ortas wine has a bouquet dominated by redcurrant and cherry. The fruit flavours are well sustained and last right through to the finish. A well balanced, firmly structured red with a smooth, textural mouthfeel.

#### CECCHI: FAMILY TRADITIONS

The Cecchi family have been prominent citizens in the Sienna region of Tuscany, the heart of Chianti, since the 15h century. In 1893 Luigi Cecchi set up business as a wine broker in Sienna. The company flourished, extending its influence well beyond Sienna, and in the years that followed, Luigi and his sons steadily grew the business, beginning to export in the 1930s.

From 1953 the company was run by Luigi's grandson, also called Luigi. Under his leadership, the company modernised radically; state-of-the-art vinification equipment was installed in the winery, up-to-date methods were introduced and the wines began to be matured in small oak barrels.

Following the death of Luigi in 2004, sons Cesare and Andre have run Cecchi with the same scrupulous attention to detail and spirit of innovation. Under their stewardship the company has invested heavily in research and development, as well as introducing specialised systems for waste water purification and the recycling of glass and packaging.

The company estates are managed on a sustainable basis, and Cecchi has been proactive in upgrading the vineyards, replanting with clones appropriate to their sites and maintaining a low cropping regime. Cecchi's comprehensive, world-class ranges of wines reflect with flair the history, culture, style and characteristics of their regions of origin.

No wine-producing country has changed more dramatically than Spain in the last thirty years. 
