Ever stood there looking at that eye-wateringly priced French wine and wondered: Does it really taste that much better? Short answer: Yes, it does. The very best expressions of the world's iconic wines constitute an experience that's hard to put into words, but it will stay with you forever. Sure, if your diet consists of sub-ten dollar cheapies from the supermarket week in, week out, then you'd probably need to do a bit of slow conditioning upwards first to get the full benefit of the experience.

Put a group of wine aficionados together and ask which wine it was for them, and there is always one that was the pivotal point, the moment when it all made sense. It could be anything from a Premier Cru Burgundy to a Grand Cru Classé Bordeaux, from a sublime Sauternes from a magic year to an aristocratic bottle of vintage champagne; perhaps even a single vineyard Barolo (these wines are by no means the sole province of the French, although they do lay claim to a great many, damn them).

With the winter settled in for a bit longer, this month's Wineletter is packed with a selection of red wines to help stave off the frost trying to attach itself to your fingers and toes. And in amongst it all, you'll find the Bucket List, a few suggestions for that special, state-of-the-art, consciousness-altering vino, should you choose to accept the mission, Mr Phelps.



The vineyards are dominated by Pinot Noir, with lesser plantings of Chardonnay, Pinot Gris and Grüner Veltliner.

Direct and to the point; loves to stir things up; adores vintage champagne; qualified viticulturist and winemaker; consummate creator when it comes to either Pinot Noir or méthode traditionnelle: these are all apt descriptors of Quartz Reef winemaker, Austrian-born Rudi Bauer. Rudi's superb méthodes champion brilliantly the true potential of our southernmost regions for sparkling wine. Rudi has completed 27 vintages in the region, and he won the first ever gold medal and trophy awarded to Central Otago. The man has history here.

When you think about it, wine really has one major function, and that is to sing in perfect harmony with food. The French and the Italians have, of course, understood this for centuries; they make many of their wines with this goal in mind. In the New World, too, we're beginning to get it. There are the tried and true (duck and Pinot, oysters and Sauvignon) that work well and can be relied on. While these matches are a great fallback position, it's quite often the ones you happen upon by chance that leave you lost for words (possibly because your mouth is full at the time). For those who'd like a hint to get started, you could try like with like: red meat, red wine; white meat, white wine; spicy food, spicy wine; rich food, rich wine... you get the drift.

The leanness of the meat lends itself to the wine's silky structure and gentle tannins.
